




Today's Bulletin Cover The Entry into Jerusalem, a 12th-century illumination created in the Holy Land, capturing the moment Jesus enters the city riding a donkey. The crowd honors Him with palm branches and garments, yet He comes not as the triumphant ruler they imagined, but as the humble Savior they truly need. The figures float against a field of gold, lending the scene an otherworldly quality that reminds us this is no ordinary procession—this is a sacred unveiling of God's way. Today, we recognize that Jesus is The Way: not always the way we expect, but the Way that leads us from death to life, from power to peace, and from fear to love.
