



Happy Easter! And welcome to First United Methodist Church of Belmont! Today we celebrate the good news of Jesus' resurrection and the hope he brings as he rises from the tomb. We recall Jesus' promise in John 11, standing at the grave of his friend Lazarus. Indeed, Jesus reminds us how often our hopes are too small. Lazarus is brought back to life, but he will one day face death again. Jesus, however, is resurrected—never to die again. Easter is not just about returning to life as it was; it is the beginning of something entirely new. In Christ, death is defeated, and all things are being made new. 
Hallelujah unto God's almighty Son.

Today's bulletin cover features Eugène Burnand's *The Disciples Peter and John Running to the Tomb on the Morning of the Resurrection*. Bathed in the soft light of dawn, the painting captures the breathless urgency of two disciples running toward the mystery of the empty tomb—toward the first signs of a world made new. Their faces reflect awe, fear, and the fragile beginnings of belief, as if the light itself is awakening something in them. Burnand offers no vision of the risen Christ, only the human response to resurrection: longing, movement, and hope. In this, we glimpse the very heart of new creation—not a finished picture, but a race toward a promise breaking into the world.
