Their faces reflect awe, fear, and the fragile beginnings of belief, as if the light itself is awakening something in them. Burnand offers no vision of the risen Christ, only the human response to resurrection: longing, movement, and hope. In this, we glimpse the very heart of new creation—not a finished picture, but a race toward a promise breaking into the world.

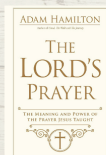

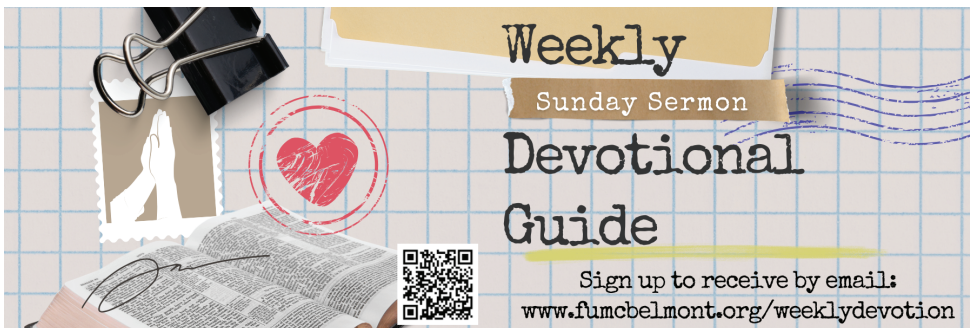
