Today's Bulletin Cover features *The Angel Appearing to Elijah* by Ferdinand Bol, an apprentice of the artist, Rembrandt. The painting likely dates from around 1642. Bol gained his fascination with Old Testament scenes that stressed God's spiritual guidance in the interactions of a young, golden haired angel in a white, flowing robe with an aged bearded patriarch from his mentor, Rembrandt. Elijah is often seen as a prefiguration of Christ. The theme of Elijah, owing to his prophecies and his role as a harbinger of the Messiah, was of particular importance in the Jewish faith. Elijah was considered the protector of the oppressed and persecuted people of Israel
