




Vineyards with a View of Auvers by Vincent van Gogh, 1890

**Today's Bulletin Cover** features *Vineyards with a View of Auvers* (1890) by Vincent van Gogh, a vivid landscape painted just weeks before his death. With its swirling brushstrokes and golden hues, the vineyard pulses with life, capturing both the beauty and fragility of the cultivated earth. Though Van Gogh struggled with mental illness, his letters often reveal a profound spirituality shaped by Scripture and a longing to experience God through creation. In John 15:1-8, Jesus proclaims, "I am the true vine," and Van Gogh's vineyard becomes more than a landscape—it becomes a metaphor for abiding, dependence, and the possibility of fruitfulness even amid brokenness. The painting invites us to imagine what it means to remain rooted in Christ, the source of our life and growth.
