

Today's Bulletin Cover features Zacchaeus in the Sycamore Awaiting the Passage of Jesus by James Tissot, a French painter who, after a successful career in fashionable society portraiture, experienced a religious conversion and devoted the latter part of his life to illustrating biblical scenes with vivid narrative power and archaeological precision. This watercolor, painted in the late 19th century as part of his Life of Christ series, captures the moment of longing and anticipation as Zacchaeus climbs above the crowd to catch a glimpse of Jesus. Tissot's attention to historical detail—drawn from his travels to the Holy Land—lends the scene an earthy realism, while the composition lifts our eyes upward echoing Zacchaeus's desire to see and be seen.
