

Today's Bulletin Cover features a detail from a 16th-century Gospel lectionary originally copied by Luke of Cyprus at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem. The illuminated scene, added later in Moscow, reflects the rich tradition of Orthodox iconography—gilded, expressive, and meant for contemplation. Though we see only a portion of the full page, the image was meant to draw readers into the world of the Gospels, where Christ meets people in their need and speaks words of healing and truth. Created at the very site believed to be where Jesus died and rose again, the manuscript and its illuminations are a living witness to the Good News, inviting us, too, to remember and share the grace we have received.

The flowers in the chancel area today are given to the glory of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and in loving memory of Martha Taylor, on the anniversary of what would be her 85th birthday on August 20, by her loving husband Preston.




