

Today's Bulletin Cover features *Christ Giving His Blessing* by Hans Memling, the leading painter in Bruges during the late 1400s. The raised right hand, with the index and middle fingers extended and the others curved toward the palm, is an ancient gesture of blessing. In the Byzantine tradition, this arrangement forms the Greek letters ICXC—an abbreviation of *Iēsous Christos*—and the two extended fingers signify Christ's divine and human natures, while the three curved fingers recall the Trinity. Memling fills the frame with the gentle, human face of the Redeemer, offering not severity but quiet grace. Christ's other hand appears to reach toward the viewer, echoing Teresa of Ávila's reminder that we are called now to be his hands in the world. Christ's blessing invites us, in turn, to be a blessing to others.

Prayer after each worship service is available in the prayer room off of the Narthex. Our Congregational Care Ministers and retired clergy are available to pray with you.


