Today's Bulletin Cover features *The Feast in the House of Simon the Pharisee* by Peter Paul Rubens, painted around 1618–1620. Rubens, a master of the Baroque, was known for his dynamic compositions, rich color, and expressive movement — all of which draw the eye toward the woman at Jesus's feet. Amid the swirl of figures and lavish setting, she becomes the true focal point: her bold act of love and gratitude quietly upends the scene. Jesus' calm acceptance stands in contrast to the judging stares around her, inviting us to consider what it means to truly see and embrace another. As we begin our #loveyourneighbor series, this image reminds us that love, not status or approval, is at the heart of our faith.


