



Today's Bulletin Cover features Thomas Cole's *The Angel Appearing to the Shepherds*. A founder of the Hudson River School, influenced by Romanticism and the natural beauty of the United States, Cole painted it in 1834 to gain attention and earn additional commissions. Bursting through the clouds, an angel announces the birth of Jesus to awe-struck shepherds. The light surrounding the angel serves as a symbol of spiritual awakening. The shepherds, for example, represent three successively higher states of spiritual response to the angel's message, beginning with the stunned fear of the praying youth and culminating in the quiet understanding of the standing elder. Some scholars have noted that the middle shepherd bears a resemblance to Cole and may be an idealized self-portrait. His presentation of the Mediterranean terrain draws on his travels in Italy, allowing us a vivid journey through this vast space before reaching the glowing cave where the Holy Family awaits.
