Good morning and welcome to First United Methodist Church of Belmont. Last week in worship, we heard Jesus preach his very first sermon in his hometown of Nazareth. Today we hear "the rest of the story." To everyone's delight, Jesus had spoken of the fulfillment of the prophet Isaiah's vision: good news to the poor, liberation, and jubilee. But he goes on, announcing this good news will not just be for Israel but also for outsiders and foreigners. Jesus seems to have gone too far as his own childhood community attempts to push him over a cliff to his death. The congregation in Nazareth heard Jesus' words as a threat. He intends them as an invitation. Will we join him in sharing the good news with all?

Today's Bulletin Cover comes from a manuscript illumination from a picture Bible created in northwest France around 1190-1200, currently housed in the *Koninklijke Bibliotheek* in The Hague. The illustration depicts Jesus being physically expelled from a city, with green grass under his bare feet, symbolizing his removal from the community. Notably, Jesus is shown carrying a book, possibly representing the Word of God, highlighting the rejection of his teachings. The work's title's use of the phrase "the Jews" refers only to the religious authorities and townspeople of that era who did not accept Jesus' message, leading to his expulsion. Throughout history the phrase has been used to stereotype, generalize and demonize Jewish people, particularly in antisemitic rhetoric, just the kind of exclusive attitude Jesus challenges with his sermon in Nazareth.
