Today's Bulletin Cover features the work of prominent 16th-century Venetian painter Jacopo Bassano, celebrated for his richly colored, mannerist compositions that harmoniously blend naturalism with vibrant tonal contrasts. In *The Miraculous Draught of Fishes*, Bassano draws inspiration from Raphael's tapestry cartoon of the same subject, yet infuses it with his distinctive style. The painting vividly depicts the astonishment of the disciples as their nets overflow under Jesus' guidance, with Peter kneeling in reverence before Christ, acknowledging his own sinfulness. This work encapsulates spiritual themes of divine providence, the transformative power of faith, and the call to discipleship, inviting viewers to reflect on their own responses to Christ's presence. The work is part of the collection at the National Gallery of Art in Washington.
