Welcome to worship at First United Methodist Church of Belmont! We're glad you are here! This morning, we continue our series exploring and celebrating Christ, the Light of the World, for all people. In today's Gospel, Jesus comes to the Jordan River to be baptized by John. John is reluctant, believing it is Jesus who should baptize him, but Jesus insists. As he enters the water, a voice from heaven announces him to be God's beloved son. John offered baptism as a sign of repentence, but for Jesus it was a commissioning, the voice from above calling and claiming his life for God's mission and purpose. The same is true for us. Just as baptism initiated the mission of Jesus Christ, so baptism is the initiation of our participation in God's mission as servants and disciples of Christ.

Thank You


To over 100 volunteers who filled 175 volunteer slots to pack, cook and deliver 4560 meals to 244 children in our community. Nine hundred and ninety of those meals were prepared hot from our kitchen. All other meals were non-perishable foods delivered to the home for the child to eat later.
