Today's Bulletin Cover features Paolo Veronese's *The Wedding Feast at Cana*, a monumental depiction of today's Gospel lesson. Veronese imagines Jesus in the midst of a typically lavish Venetian banquet, known for their sumptuous food, music and size. Veronese's masterful use of vibrant colors, dynamic composition, and intricate details captures both the exuberance of the celebration and the divine presence of Christ at its center (in a bit of foreshadowing, directly underneath the butcher wielding his knife). It is the largest painting in the Louvre, measuring nearly 7 meters high by 10 meters wide, with over 130 characters filling the canvas. Rooted in Renaissance artistry, the painting portrays Jesus as both approachable and transformative, inviting viewers to see abundance and joy as signs of God's grace.
