January is a time of new beginnings, a fresh start after the busyness of the holiday season. As 2025 dawns, I'm excited to share with you our 2025 Scripture Focus. Following an incredibly enriching journey through Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in 2023 and Paul's Letter to the Ephesians in 2024, our 2025 Scripture Focus will be First and Second Peter.

As your pastor, I am more and more mindful of the challenges we face in living holy and faithful lives. So much competes for and vies for our time, devotion and attention. And there are voices in our world who want to lay claim to our faith, molding it to advance agendas far from the call of Jesus Christ.

First and Second Peter are short but powerful letters written to Christians facing similar, though far more difficult challenges. Peters gives challenging encouragement and hope to remain steadfast in faith, living holy lives after the example of Christ. The best way to counter the challenges we face as Christians? According to Peter, it's to grow. As 2 Peter 3:18 urges, "But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and forever!"

So... as 2025 begins, how might we grow in grace this year?

First, we can grow in personal discipleship. Grace flourishes when we dedicate ourselves to prayer, Scripture, and worship. These practices root us in God's presence and shape our hearts to reflect God's love for others. A question to ponder: How will I create space in my daily life to nurture my relationship with God? Perhaps start with a commitment to read just a few verses from First and Second Peter each day? Or make plans to join a small group this winter, or simply setting aside quiet time for prayer. Whatever it is, let's take intentional steps to grow as disciples in 2025.

Second, we can grow by committing to the needs of others, especially the marginalized. Jesus' ministry consistently demonstrated care for the poor, the outcast, and the forgotten. As His followers, we are called to do the same. How might FUMC Belmont embody grace by advocating for justice and serving those in need? What specific action can you take this year to extend God's grace to someone on the margins?

Finally, we can grow by becoming hopeful people. Peter reminds us in the opening lines of his letter that we have been given a living hope in a resurrected and living savior, Jesus Christ. In a world often weighed down by negativity and uncertainty, we are called to be bearers of hope! Hope is an expression of grace that inspires and sustains not only ourselves but also those around us. How can you speak and live in ways that cultivate hope in your life and in our community?

As we journey through 2025, may we embrace these opportunities to grow in grace. Together, let us deepen our discipleship, serve others with compassion, and shine as hopeful witnesses to God's love. Growing in grace is not a solitary endeavor but a shared calling as the body of Christ. Let's encourage one another and celebrate the ways God is working in and through us this year.
