Today's Bulletin Cover features James Tissot's painting *Jesus Unrolls the Book in the Synagogue*. His meticulous attention to detail is evident in the worshippers' attire, notably the prayer shawls, and the synagogue's setting, including the elaborate silver ornaments of the Torah scroll. Born in France in 1836, Tissot was a successful painter of Paris society before moving to London in 1871. After a profound religious experience he shifted his focus to biblical scenes, undertaking extensive travels to the Middle East to ensure historical accuracy in his work. Spiritually, this painting invites us to reflect on Jesus' proclamation of bringing good news to the poor and freedom to the oppressed. As we observe the reactions of those in the synagogue—ranging from wonder to skepticism—we are prompted to consider our own responses to Christ's message and our role in embodying his mission in today's world.
