




Covered in bright colors and simple messages like "God is Love," it invites all who see it to consider the journey of faith as one marked by trust, devotion, and wonder. Much like the psalmist lifting eyes to the hills, Knight's mountain points beyond itself — to a God who keeps watch over us and calls us ever onward. Recognized as a National Folk Art Site, *Salvation Mountain* stands as a testament to the power of persistent faith and creative witness in the most unexpected places.


