



Good morning and welcome to First United Methodist Church of Belmont! Today we continue our summer journey through the Psalms—biblical prayers and songs that give voice to the full range of human experience. From joy to sorrow, from trust to fear, the Psalms remind us that every part of life matters to God and belongs in God's presence. This morning, we turn to Psalm 13, which begins with a raw and honest cry: "How long, O Lord?" It is a prayer of lament, naming pain and pleading for light. Yet even in the depths, the psalmist chooses trust. As we worship, we bring our whole selves before God, knowing we are held by grace and surrounded by love.

Today's Bulletin Cover features *Jeremiah Lamenting the Destruction of Jerusalem* by Rembrandt van Rijn (1630), an early oil painting by the Dutch master that portrays the prophet seated in grief amid the ruins of a fallen city. Painted when Rembrandt was just 24 years old, the work captures the raw emotional weight of lament through Jeremiah's hunched posture, hand to brow, and the glint of temple vessels cast aside—symbols of desecrated worship and national collapse. Behind him, Jerusalem burns, a visual echo of divine judgment, while a scroll—likely representing the book of Lamentations—rests close at hand. As a prophet who wept over the people's refusal to turn back to God, Jeremiah embodies the sorrow and spiritual resilience also voiced in Psalm 13, where the psalmist pleads, "How long, O Lord?" This pairing invites reflection on lament not as a lack of faith, but as its most courageous and honest expression amid divine silence and collective suffering.
