




The Multiplication of the Loaves by Pablo Mayorga, 1984

Today's Bulletin Cover features Pablo Mayorga's *The Multiplication of the Loaves* from Solentiname, Nicaragua. Reflecting the liberation theology of Ernesto Cardenal's Solentiname community, the artwork embodies a simple yet powerful expression of faith, solidarity, and divine provision. Cardenal, a poet, priest, and revolutionary, fostered a community of peasants who created folk art that reimagined biblical stories through the lens of their lived experiences, blending faith with a call for social justice and communal care. As one member of the community said, "The miracle was to persuade the owners of the bread to share it, that it was absurd for them to keep it all while the people were going hungry."

CALLED CHARGE CONFERENCE There will be a called meeting of the Charge Conference, our church's governing body, on <u>Sunday, March 30, 2025 at 10:00 AM</u> in the sanctuary. 
