Today's Bulletin Cover features Fra Angelico's *Transfiguration*, a masterpiece that bridges the worlds of sacred iconography and Renaissance naturalism, inviting us into the mystery of Christ's divine revelation. Rooted in the Gospel account of Luke 9:28-43, the painting captures the radiant moment when Jesus, flanked by Moses and Elijah, is transfigured before the awestruck disciples. Like an icon, it is not merely a depiction but a window into the divine, guiding us into contemplation rather than mere observation. The golden light surrounding Christ symbolizes His divine nature, while the disciples' postures—ranging from wonder to fear—reflect our own responses to God's revelation. Through this work, Fra Angelico invites us to move beyond intellectual understanding into worship, beholding the mystery of God's presence that transforms both vision and heart.

Prayer after each worship service is available in the prayer room off of the Narthex. Our Congregational Care Ministers and retired clergy are available to pray with you.

LENT BEGINS ON WEDNESDAY The Season of Lent, the forty-day season leading to Easter, begins this week on Ash Wednesday. Join us for worship at 11 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. The service includes the imposition of ashes, which we will prepare at the conclusion of today's eleven o'clock service from the palm branches we waved on Palm Sunday last year. Their burning is a reminder of our brokenness and mortality – and of the transforming power of Christ, whose light shines always, even in the darkness, setting us free for a new future of hope.


