




Today's Bulletin Cover features Vincent van Gogh's *Starry Night Over the Rhône*, painted in 1888 during his time in Arles. The deep blues of the night sky contrast with the golden glow of gas lamps, their reflections shimmering across the Rhône River. Van Gogh's bold, expressive brushstrokes capture not just the scene, but the tension between light and darkness that marked his inner world. In his letters written at the time to his brother Theo, he spoke often of his struggles with despair, yet also of moments of solace found in the light that pierced through the shadows—whether from the stars above or the lamps below. This interplay of light and darkness became a symbol of hope for him. Similarly, Christ, the Light of the World, offers us that same hope, guiding us through our moments of uncertainty. Just as the shimmering lights on the water bring movement and depth to van Gogh's work, Christ's light reaches us even in our darkest times, illuminating the way forward with grace and hope.
