



Welcome to worship on this Fourth Sunday in Lent, a season of reflection and spiritual preparation as we journey toward the cross and resurrection of Christ. The flowers in the chancel area are given to the glory of God and in memory of The Reverend William (Bill) Robbins Ragsdale, Sr., on the occasion of his 85th birthday on March 26 by Annie Joe, George, Catherine, Claire and Anne Louise Ragsdale.

Today's Bulletin Cover features *The Good Shepherd* by Daniel Bonnell, a powerful and unconventional portrayal of Jesus as the Shepherd among his sheep. Using a stark contrast of blue and white, the painting creates an almost dreamlike effect, where the silhouetted figure of Christ blends into the landscape of the flock. The outstretched arms of the shepherd resemble the shape of the cross, subtly reminding us that the Good Shepherd not only leads and protects his sheep but also lays down his life for them. The sheep, depicted in abstract, swirling forms, seem to merge with Christ himself, emphasizing the deep connection between the Shepherd and his flock.
