




Good morning and welcome to First United Methodist Church of Belmont! Today marks the First Sunday in Lent, a forty-day season of spiritual preparation leading to Easter on April 20. These forty days echo Jesus' journey in the wilderness after his baptism and the Israelites' forty years in the wilderness after God delivered them from slavery in Egypt. We begin our Lenten journey where the Israelites' deliverance began—with God calling Moses at the burning bush. In this moment, Moses learns God's name, "I Am," a mysterious and holy name that evokes awe and wonder. What does it mean to know the name of God? And what does it mean for Jesus to claim this name for himself, as he does throughout the Gospel of John? This Lent, we invite you to join us as we explore these powerful "I Am" sayings of Jesus, celebrating the good news that such revelation is a sign of God's deep desire for a personal relationship with each of us. As we grow in that relationship, we discover more clearly who we are and the calling God has placed on our lives. May this series draw us closer to the God who is, and transform us as we seek to follow Christ.

Today's Bulletin Cover features the "Moses and the Burning Bush" mural at Dura-Europos, a Roman outpost in Syria, that dates to around 239 CE. It is one of the most significant early Jewish artworks ever discovered. The painting depicts Moses encountering God in the burning bush, with a divine hand gesturing from above, symbolizing God's presence. This iconography of the hand appears throughout the synagogue, reinforcing God's active involvement in key moments of Israel's history. The mural reflects the deep reverence and awe associated with God's revelation and presence in the lives of the Israelites.

Prayer after each worship service is available in the prayer room off of the Narthex. Our Congregational Care Ministers and retired clergy are available to pray with you.

You're invited to walk the labyrinth this Lenten season. Our outdoor prayer labyrinth is available to everyone during daylight hours. It is located in the pavilion at the playground area. Labyrinths have been used by Christians for prayer and mediation for centuries. For medieval Christians, walking the labyrinth was imagined to be a spiritual journey to the Holy Land. For others, it provides a metaphor for the Christian journey itself, offering time to listen, discern and respond to God as you walk its sacred path.




