#### Dear FUMC Family,

Soon we will enter the sacred season of Lent. In many ways, the Lenten journey is at the heart of who we are as FUMC Belmont, because Lent is fundamentally a journey of becoming more like Jesus. Lent is often associated with fasting or giving something up, but never as ends unto themselves. They are, ultimately, about returning to the practices that shape us into Christ's likeness.

John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, understood this well. He often spoke of the "means of grace"—practices like prayer, fasting, Scripture reading, and acts of mercy—as ways that God's Spirit transforms us. Wesley believed that these disciplines were not empty rituals but powerful avenues for encountering Christ and growing in holiness.

This is why spiritual disciplines matter: they are not about earning God's love or proving our spiritual acumen but about positioning ourselves to receive God's grace more deeply. The early Church understood this, too.

The fourth century bishop of Caesarea, St. Basil the Great, once said, "He who is full of virtue and good works is like a tree laden with fruit; he who is full of iniquity is like a dry tree, ready for the fire. The soul must train itself with great care." Through "training," attending to the means of grace and disciplines of our faith, we grow and bear good fruit in Christ.

Many Christians today are rediscovering the power of spiritual disciplines. A movement called *Practicing the Way* reminds us that following Jesus isn't just about believing the right things—it's about embodying His way of life. Jesus Himself regularly withdrew to pray, fasted in the wilderness, engaged deeply with Scripture, and lived in close community with others. If we want to be transformed, we must walk as Christ walked.


This Lent, I invite you to commit to a spiritual discipline—whether it's fasting, daily Scripture meditation, silent prayer, or intentional acts of service. Ask the Holy Spirit to use this time to shape you into the image of Christ.

One important means of grace and disciplines at the heart of United Methodism is meeting together with other Christians. Our small groups this Lent will use a guide provided by *Practicing the Way* to explore spiritual disciplines and practices that make us, in their words, "apprentices" to Christ. Groups will spend time

sharing, practicing and reflecting together. Truly, I cannot imagine a better way to get to know new people at FUMC AND grow in faith through the Lenten season. Read on to learn more about those groups and sign up today.

May this Lenten season be one of renewal, as we journey together in the way of Jesus. Thank you for allowing me to serve as your pastor.


