Today's Bulletin Cover features *The Adoration of the Lamb* from the Codex Aureus of Saint Emmeram, an illuminated Gospel book created around 870 in the court of Charles the Bald—grandson of Charlemagne and a patron of the Carolingian Renaissance. This richly adorned manuscript, with its gold leaf and jeweled covers, reflects both imperial grandeur and deep devotion. At its center is the Lamb of God, enthroned and worshiped by angels and saints, drawn from the heavenly vision in Revelation. It is a visual confession that power and glory belong not to emperors or earthly rulers, but to the Lamb.

Prayer after each worship service is available in the prayer room off of the Narthex. Our Congregational Care Ministers and retired clergy are available to pray with you.
