Today's Bulletin Cover features the *Loaves and Fishes* mosaic in Tabgha, Israel. Located in the Church of the Multiplication, it is a key example of early Byzantine Christian art, capturing the story from today's Gospel Lesson with striking simplicity and symbolism. Crafted in the 5th century, the mosaic uses earthy tones and minimalistic forms to depict two fish flanking a basket with four loaves, inviting contemplation of Jesus's miracle in feeding the multitude. The absence of a fifth loaf, a detail thought to signify the Eucharistic bread at the altar above, reflects the mosaic's spiritual depth and connection to the worshipping community's celebration of Holy Communion. Restored in the 1980s, the original mosaic measured 5,300 square feet. It was first discovered in the nineteenth century.


Midweek Fellowship Meals Wednesday - 5:30 to 6:30 p.m.

Nov. 13: Chicken alfredo, green salad, zucchini and squash, chicken nuggets and dessert.


Meals cost FUMC \$10 per adult, \$5 for children. We ask those who join us to contribute what they can.
