Welcome to First United Methodist Church of Belmont! This morning we continue our worship series, BELOVED: God's First and Final Word on Who You Are. Inspired by the writings of Henri Nouwen, we reflect on a familiar pattern from the Gospels: bread taken, blessed, broken, and given. At his last meal with the disciples, Jesus revealed that this pattern was not only about bread but about his own life. As we grow to be more like him, we begin to see the same pattern in our own lives as well—especially in our brokenness. To be called Beloved does not mean escaping suffering, but discovering God's presence within it. Today we listen for how God meets us in our pain and sorrow, blesses us there, and transforms even our wounds into gifts for the world.






Advent Small Group Begins Thursday Dec. 4 11 a.m. - Route 66 Classroom
