

**Today's Bulletin Cover** features *Waiting for the Blessing* (1891) by Ukrainian artist Mykola Pymonenko. The painting depicts villagers gathered on Easter morning, holding loaves of bread to be blessed by the priest. In Ukrainian tradition, the blessing of bread and food is a central part of the Paschal feast, a sign of God's provision and resurrection joy. On this All Saints' Sunday, the image invites us to see ourselves among them—waiting together for God's blessing, remembering the saints who have gone before us, and trusting in the promise of new life.
