



Today's Bulletin Cover features the work of John August Swanson, an American visual artist known for works in oil, watercolor, acrylic and mixed media, as well as serigraphs, lithographs and etchings. His art reflects the strong heritage of storytelling he inherited from his Mexican mother and Swedish father. Over the course of five years, Swanson explored the Raising of Lazarus with various drawings, including an original watercolor which was later developed into a serigraph edition. He writes, "In this visual narrative I have sought a richness of color, tonality and texture. The tomb is not located in a desolate place. It is surrounded by numerous figures carrying the things of life – candlelight and flowers, music, tears and prayer. The picture contains many elements but has a central focus. It seeks to present, with simple clarity, the reality of death in the midst of life and the miracle of life in the midst of death."

WHAT IS A KONTAKION? This morning as we celebrate All Saints Sunday we will sing a portion of modern Kontakion. A Kontakion is a form of hymn from the Byzantine liturgical tradition. The word derives from the Greek which means "rod" or "stick," and refers to the rod around which a scroll is wound, a reference to the fact that kontakions tended to be lengthy, requiring a great deal of "scrolling," in the ancient sense of the word!


A Supply Sabbath
