#### Dear FUMC Family,

Not long ago, in the middle of a difficult decision, a dear friend spoke a single word to me. When I heard it, something inside me knew it was the right word for the moment. It resonated deep in my soul, and it still does. I wonder if it might be a word for you, too—a word for our whole church family and our community in these months together.

The word? Beloved.

Beloved is the word God's Holy Spirit speaks over Jesus as he is baptized in the Jordan River. As the spiritual writer Henri Nouwen reminds us, "What is said of Jesus is also said of you: you are the Beloved child of God. This is the one truth worth claiming, the truth that makes all the difference." The deepest truth of our lives is not what we achieve, what we possess, or what others say about us, but this: we are God's beloved sons and daughters.

It is a word for us to hold close in these months ahead. On November 2, we celebrated All Saints Sunday, remembering the beloved among us who have gone before us to be with God. Beginning November 9, we'll turn to a three-week series in worship called *BELOVED: God's First and Final Word on Who You Are*, asking together how we live into this deep and profound truth as disciples of Jesus. Then on November 30, we enter the Season of Advent. This year's theme is A SEASON OF PROMISE. Truly, Advent opens our hearts to the coming of Christ, the Beloved child in the manger, God's promise of love made visible.

The promise at the heart of Christmas is that God comes to us in Christ so that He might make us God's beloved, too. Jesus' whole life was spent revealing God's love to others, especially those who had never imagined such love to be possible. As I remind us often, the most common complaint made of Jesus was that he ate with and welcomed the wrong people: tax collectors, foreigners, and sinners

The Gospels tell us Jesus' mealtimes followed a familiar pattern. Again and again, they say, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it. It is a pattern about more than food—it was about his life. And it is about ours, too. If we are serious about living our mission to be more like Jesus Christ for our community, then we will see our lives following the same pattern: chosen by God, blessed to be a blessing, even in our brokenness, and given in love for the world.


The holidays are filled with joy, but they can also sharpen the ache of our brokenness—grief, loneliness, strained relationships, or longings that remain unmet. Henri Nouwen reminds us that being Beloved does not mean escaping suffering, but discovering God's presence even in it. Our brokenness, held under God's blessing, can become a place where love takes root and grows.

The good news of Advent is that Christ comes not to the strong or the perfect, but to the weary, the searching, the brokenhearted. And the miracle of it all is that God not only calls us Beloved in our own brokenness, but also sends us to be love for others who desperately need to hear and see that word in tangible ways.

In the pages that follow, you'll find ways our church family is living into this high calling—opportunities to worship, celebrate, give, serve, and share God's love in our community. I hope you'll read on, and more than that, find ways to join us. Because in Christ, the Beloved who came to us, we discover that no matter what, we are God's beloved too—with gifts and love to share in blessing the whole world.






