Dear FUMC Family,

Catherine, Claire, Anne Louise and I continue to be so very grateful for your prayers and support as we find our way after the parsonage fire on September 28. We have been overwhelmed at every turn by your love, kindness, patience and generosity. Thank you all.

In the days after the fire, Anne Louise looked at me one afternoon and said, "I just realized we won't have Christmas at home this year." Over my years in ministry, I have been amazed by how often, in the face of grief or divorce or other loss, our minds go immediately to this time of year. So much that brings us joy is tied to memories of people, places, sights and sounds from our past. Our sense of nostalgia longs to experience them again.

Of course, the first Christmas happened far away from Mary and Joseph's home in Nazareth, a trip mandated by the occupying force of Rome. Then, the Holy Family spent the first years of Jesus' life as illegal refugees to Egypt, on the run from King Herod. These tragic details of the Christmas story only deepen the reality of the good news: the baby born in Bethlehem is Emmanuel, God with us. And as Paul proclaims in Romans 8, because of Jesus nothing can separate us from God's love.

For many, the coming holiday season will be a difficult one. Please know that your church family is here for you. I hope you will consider joining us for our annual service of Hope and Consolation on Thursday, December 5 at 6:30 in the sanctuary. Through beautiful music, scripture, art and poetry we will gather to mark and remember the losses we have experienced and still feel so deeply, and to be reminded of the hope of Christ that shines in every darkness.

Through it all my deepest prayer, as your pastor, is that each of us will know and experience the peace of Christ and find our true home in Him, at the very heart of God.



#### RACIAL HEALING AND RECONCILIATION

I recently spent the weekend in the Chapel Hill area with my daughter's family. As we visited our granddaughter's school, played in city parks, and went about town, I was struck by the different ethnicities, languages, accents I heard almost everywhere we went. I think the variety was so striking to me because it was such a contrast to the homogeneous community in and around Belmont. And while I love where I live, I couldn't help but feel that the many differences I noticed made for a richer, more interesting community. I also couldn't help but reflect on the fact that living with such variety of people is a better preparation for the kingdom of heaven. In Revelation 7:9 we see "a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb." God's ultimate vision for humanity is not so much a melting pot in which we all merge into one, but more of a stew where the different flavors enhance each ingredient, while retaining individual uniqueness. I wonder if we were to make room for greater ethnic and racial variety in our community and congregation we would actually be cooking up a foretaste of the kingdom of heaven.

#### **SERVICE AND MISSIONS**



It was during a school break in 2001 when Preston Taylor was at a stop light with his wife Martha and noticed many children playing outside their homes. Preston wondered, what could these children possibly be eating for lunch since they appeared to be home alone. Out of his concern for the children Preston and his wife Martha launched the Feed the Children program at our church. For over 20 years we have been delivering meals to the children in our community during Christmas and spring break. Teams cook several hot meals for delivery during the break, and other volunteers pack grocery bags with pre-packaged nonperishable foods. Included in the grocery bags will be heat and serve snacks, breakfast, and lunch/dinner items which the children can prepare at home with a microwave. We typically will serve meals to over 200 children. When we tally the number of meals

prepacked in grocery bags we will deliver over 4,500 meals over 12 days to children in our community.

Over thirty volunteers a day are needed to deliver the meals and bags of food to every home that asks for food assistance. Volunteers are needed to help pack grocery bags of food, cook the hot meals or help deliver on selected days over the Christmas break. 

#### FUMC RECEIVES WNC FOUNDATION HOPE FUND GRANT FOLLOWING PARSONAGE FIRE



FUMC Belmont received a grant of \$2,500 from the Hope Fund of the United Methodist Foundation of Western North Carolina. The Hope Fund was established in 2021 as a way for the Foundation to respond with a "gift of hope" to churches in the WNC Conference of the United Methodist Church who suffer a loss to their physical property (including church parsonages) due to events such as fire, storm and flood. The gift was recommended by the Foundation staff and was sent along with prayers of support. FUMC has long partnered with the Foundation, who manages several church endowments and memorial funds and issued the loan for our 2021 narthex expansion and sanctuary renovation. Their mission is to "build the Church for generations to come," and this gift to us is but one more expression of that commitment. We are grateful for their generosity and the connection that is our United Methodist Church family!
