Today's Bulletin Cover features *Jesus* and the One Leper Who Returned to Give Thanks by William Brassey Hole (1846–1917), an English-born, Edinburgh-based painter, etcher, and illustrator who became a member of the Royal Scottish Academy. Celebrated in Scotland for his vast mural friezes, Hole also turned late in life to biblical subjects, traveling to Palestine to render the Gospels with greater authenticity. This image comes from his eighty-piece series The Life of Jesus of Nazareth, where naturalistic colors, strong lines, and carefully observed setting bring Luke's story to life and focus our attention on the lone figure who turns back in gratitude.

Our 2025 Stewardship and Generosity Campaign is also called OUTGROW. As we explore the prayers and habits God calls us to release in order to grow in faith, we also consider how we might outgrow fear, pride, or hesitation in order to grow into a deeper relationship with God through our generosity. Each step of giving is a step of trust, rooted not in abundance but in the God who provides. Campaign packets are available in the narthex at the information center.
