Today's Bulletin Cover features *The Light of the World*, an allegorical painting by English artist William Holman Hunt, completed between 1851 and 1853. It depicts Jesus preparing to knock on an overgrown door, inspired by Revelation 3:20: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock." Hunt wrote of the work, "I painted the picture with what I thought, unworthy though I was, to be divine command, and not simply a good subject." The door in the painting has no handle and thus can only be opened from the inside, symbolizing the invitation to respond to Christ's persistent call. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells of a widow who refuses to give up seeking justice. In her persistence we glimpse the character of God—knocking, seeking, pressing toward us in love until we are changed. Hunt's painting, long considered one of the most significant renderings of Christ, now hangs in the chapel of Keble College, Oxford.
