He teaches at a private art school that he started in 1982. Soichi was drawn to God as an undergraduate student during a home Bible study when he encountered Mark 8:35: "Whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me and for the gospel will save it." Watanabe writes, "In retrospect I realize that [my works] are my own humble responses to God's calling in my life. ... The images are often given to me through the words of God, at worship services on Sundays, and during my daily devotions. I have the earnest hope that I will go on painting to praise the Lord."


