

Welcome to worship at First United Methodist Church of Belmont. Today we begin a new series, Outgrow, exploring the prayers and habits we sometimes cling to but may need to release in order to grow in our relationship with God. This first week we hear the disciples' plea, "Lord, increase our faith!" in Luke 17. Like them, we often assume we need more — more faith, more courage, more resources — before we can be obedient to Jesus' call. Yet Jesus reminds us that faith is not about plenty, but about risk of trust, even when it begins small.

**Today's Bulletin Cover** features Vincent van Gogh's *The Mulberry Tree* (1889). Painted during a brief respite from a dark period in Van Gogh's life at the asylum in Saint-Rémy, the tree bursts with fiery colors and surging vitality through bold, swirling brushstrokes. Mulberry trees were known for their deep roots, strength, and resilience — qualities Van Gogh brings to life on the canvas. In Luke 17, Jesus says that even faith no bigger than a mustard seed is greater still, able to do what seems impossible. Faith is not about quantity or certainty, but about the life of God at work within us.

**Our 2025 Stewardship and Generosity Campaign** is also called OUTGROW. As we explore the prayers and habits God calls us to release in order to grow in faith, we also consider how we might outgrow fear, pride, or hesitation in order to grow into a deeper relationship with God through our generosity.
