"But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light." -1 Peter 2:9

Dear FUMC Family,



One of my seminary ethics professors used to say that "the task of a theologian is to make it difficult to be a Christian." I've never forgotten that. As we've read First and Second Peter, and shared some of their powerful passages in worship this month, I've felt the weight of that truth. It is difficult to be a Christian. The first recipients of Peter's letters knew this, but he encouraged and spurred them on—just as he does for us today.

Peter reminds us that though we are "exiles and strangers" in this world, called to live in the world but not of it, we are also chosen by God. At the center of our faith is Jesus, the one rejected and crucified, who has now been raised from the dead. To follow him is to live according to the logic of the cross and resurrection, a way of life that only makes sense if Easter is true.

Peter presses us toward patience, echoing the patience of God who is merciful and longsuffering toward us. He warns us that the Christian life will not be made easier by any promise of comfort or convenience. If anyone tells you otherwise, run! For to be a Christian is to stake your life on a reality that the world cannot comprehend, and to keep trusting that God is faithful.

And yet, as difficult as it is, the Christian life is not impossible. As Peter writes, we have been "born anew to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1:3). That living hope is what steadies us, carries us, and keeps us going. Our strength does not come from ourselves but from God, whose grace is always sufficient. John Wesley described grace not as a passive idea but as a dynamic power—a power that can sanctify, change, and transform us. We receive that power through the practices that open us to God's presence—prayer and worship, study and service, life shared together in community. In these ways, God faithfully meets us, strengthens us, and shapes us more and more into Christ's likeness.



Our calling, FUMC Belmont, is to be "means of grace" together: bearing one another's burdens, supporting, challenging, and encouraging each other as brothers and sisters in faith—so that, as hard as it might be, we can follow Christ with courage, faith, and conviction.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your pastor.





Prayer is where God shapes our hearts. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus meets those asking for more faith, those healed yet slow to give thanks, and those tempted to give up too soon. In each encounter, he calls us to outgrow the prayers that keep us comfortable and to grow into trust that acts, gratitude that overflows, and perseverance that does not lose heart. Join us this October as we explore how deeper prayer helps us grow and mature in Christ, deepens our faith in the face of an uncertain future, and opens our lives more fully to God's work in us and in the world.

## October 5 - "Lord, Increase Our Faith!"

Luke 17:5–10: The prayer that wants more—but doesn't use what it already has.

Why are we always asking God for more faith? What if the real invitation is to be faithful with what we already have? Faith isn't certainty—it's acting even when you still have questions.

### October 12 - "Where Are the Other Nine?"

Luke 17:11–19: The prayer we forget to pray—thank you.

Gratitude is more than a feeling—it's an action. One healed man turns back to thank Jesus. Will we remember to do the same?

## October 19 - "Pray Always and Do Not Lose Heart"

Luke 18:1–8: The prayer that gives up too soon.

Jesus tells a story about a widow who refuses to stop knocking. Persistence in prayer isn't about wearing God down—it's about being opened up to God's transforming justice.



#### October 26 - Children's Sabbath (Observed)

The Rev. Gaston Warner, CEO of Zoe Empowers will be preaching. We are celebrating Children's Sabbath in connection with Zoe Sunday. It is a multifaith call to bear witness, to celebrate, and to act on behalf of children's lives, well-being, and futures. 








# Reflections from Our Piece of Cake Project
