Today's Bulletin Cover features the *Icon of the Resurrection*, also known as Christ's Descent into Hades, a central image of Easter in the Orthodox tradition. Painted with vivid colors and layered symbolism, it shows Christ breaking the golden gates of hell, now shattered in half beneath His feet, with Death bound in chains at the bottom of the abyss. He lifts Adam and Eve from their graves while saints and prophets look on, bearing witness to God's redeeming work across all generations. Around Him shines a radiant mandorla—an almond-shaped field of divine light that reveals God's glory breaking into the darkest place. Echoing 1 Peter's vision of Christ proclaiming good news to the imprisoned spirits, this icon reminds us that no depth is beyond the reach of resurrection hope.

Prayer after each worship service is available in the prayer room off of the Narthex. Our Congregational Care Ministers and retired clergy are available to pray with you.


Sunday School
